| In the event of an outbreak, a school may be advised by their local health team or director of public health to undertake testing for staff and students of secondary age and above for a period of time | | X | |

| Face coverings are no longer advised for pupils, staff and visitors in classrooms or communal areas | | | |
| Staff and pupils should follow wider advice on face coverings outside of school, including on transport to and from school | | \boxtimes | |
| A director of public health might advise you that face coverings should temporarily be worn in communal areas or classrooms (by pupils, staff and visitors, unless exempt) | You should make sure your contingency plans cover this possibility | | |
| Transparent face coverings, which may assist communication with someone who relies on lip reading, clear sound or facial expression to communicate, can also be worn in these circumstances | Transparent face coverings may be effective in reducing the spread of COVID-19. However, the evidence to support this is currently very limited | | |
| Face coverings (whether transparent or cloth) should fit securely around the face to cover the nose and mouth and be made with a breathable material capable of filtering airborne particles | | | |
| Face visors or shields can be worn by those exempt from wearing a face covering but they are not an equivalent alternative in terms of source control of virus transmission | Visors may protect against droplet spread in specific circumstances but are unlikely to be effective in preventing aerosol transmission, and therefore in a school environment are unlikely to offer appropriate protection to the wearer. Visors should only be used by those exempt from wearing a face covering after carrying out a risk assessment for the specific situation and should always be cleaned appropriately | | |

| Staff/pupils/cleaners/contractors etc. will be reminded to clean their hands regularly, including; • when they arrive at the school • when they return from breaks • when they change rooms • before and after eating | All Children sanitise their hands before entering and leaving. | Hands are washed with liquid soap & water for a minimum of 20 seconds | This is something all children and adults are accustomed to. | × | |
| The school has considered whether they have enough hand washing or hand sanitiser 'stations' available so that all pupils and staff can clean their hands regularly | Additional sanitising liquids have been purchased and sanitiser is available upon entrance to each area of nursery and in each room for use throughout the day. | | |
| The preferred method of washing hands is through the use of soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Where this may be impractical or difficult to achieve (e.g. due to time constraints in between lessons) then this can be supplemented with the use of alcohol based hand cleansers/gels. However, the use of such gels is not a substitute for hand washing. Such gels MUST ONLY BE USED UNDER CLOSE SUPERVISION.
